(1800-41); (peddler/physician)
(Emigrated from Fintona, County Tyrone, Ireland to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, 1820s); (died of typhus)

= Catherine Gavin (1810-87)
(owned pawn shop)

6 Others Ignatius Loyola Donnelly
(1831-1901); (Rep/Populist); (lawyer/writer)
(born Philadelphia PA); (moved to Dakota co. Minnesota, 1856/57); (founder, Nininger City utopian community, but ruined by Panic of 1857)
(LT Governor of Minnesota, 1860-63)

1850

(US House, 1863-68; early supporter of Women's Suffrage); (Washington DC railroad lobbyist, then newspaper correspondent)
(moved back to Minnesota); (co-founder, Anti-Monopolist Party, 1873; publisher, The Anti-Monopolist Newspaper, 1874-)
(MN senate, 1874-78)
(author of best selling books: Atlantis: The Antediluvian World, 1882; Ragnarak & The Age of Fire & Gravel, 1883)
(reputation as a writer ruined by his assertion, in the Great Cryptogram, that Francis Bacon authored William Shakespeare's plays)
(MN house, 1888)
(Populist Candidate for US Vice President, 1900)
