(Emigrated from Bristol, Gloucestershire, England to New York, 1832); (moved to New Jersey, then Cincinnati, Ohio, 1837)
 (sugar refiner in England); (abolitionist/friend of William Lloyd Garrison in US); (failed businessman)

= Harriet Lane (1792-1870)
 (founded private school in Cincinnati after husband's death)

Dr. Elizabeth Blackwell
 (1821-1910)

(Emigrated from Bristol, Gloucestershire,
 England to New York, 1832)

(moved to New Jersey, then Cincinnati, Ohio, 1837)
 (first female doctor in US with degree;
 from Geneva Medical College, 1849)

(moved to NYC; opened all female physician
 New York Infirmary for Indigent Women & Children, 1856;
 then Women's Medical College at this hospital, 1868)
 (moved to London, England, 1869, to found
 the London School of Medicine for Women)
 (professor of gynecology,
 London School of Medicine for Children, 1875-1907)
 (never married)

= Rev. Antoinette Louisa Brown
 (1825-1921); (suffragette/lecturer/author/novelist)
 (born Henrietta, Monroe co. NY)
 (attended Oberlin College in Ohio;
 only received theological degree 25 years late in 1878)
 (advocate of Abolition of Slavery & Temperance;
 attended World's Temperance Association in NYC, 1853)
 (first ordained woman minister,
 First Congregationalist Church in South Butler NY, 1853-54)
 (became Unitarian minister at
 All Souls Unitarian Church in Elizabeth, Essex co. New Jersey, 1908-21)

 (1825-1909); (merchant)

(Emigrated from Bristol, Gloucestershire, England to New York, 1832)
 (moved to New Jersey, then Cincinnati, Ohio, 1837); (moved to NJ)

 (born Brockfield, Worcester co. MA)
 (founder/editor, Woman's Journal, 1870)
 (kept maiden name; model for other "Lucy Stoners")

 (1826-1910)

(Emigrated from
 Bristol, Gloucestershire,

(moved to New Jersey,
 then Cincinnati, Ohio, 1837)
 (medical degree from
 Western Reserve Academy
 in Cleveland, Ohio, 1854,
 then studied in Europe)
 (moved to NYC, 1856,
 to join sister at
 NY Infirmary for Indigent
 Women & Children;
 managed the institution,
 1869-1900)
 (moved to Maine to retire, 1900)
 (never married)
